The Extraordinary Life and Legacy of William Thomson, Lord Kelvin: Absolute Zero Hero

World Refrigeration Day now marks the birthday of William Thomson, Lord Kelvin, on the date of his birth, 26th June. This year, 2024, is the 200th anniversary of his birth in Belfast.



To celebrate World Refrigeration Day 2024, the Institute of Refrigeration Ireland is pleased to present a series of events celebrating the life and work of Lord Kelvin, William Thomson of Belfast. The events will take place in the newly redeveloped '**The Kelvin'** building on the site at College Square East in Belfast where William Thompson was born.

The events centre around a talk on the extraordinary life and legacy of the man who became known as Lord Kelvin, whose name is forever associated with refrigeration and the temperature scale used to pinpoint Absolute Zero, the lowest possible temperature in the universe.
